Four of the participating agencies were founded by LAUSD staff.

The Asian Pacific Community Fund (APCF) and its network of 77 community organizations serve over 1 million people annually in a total of 35 Asian languages plus English and Spanish. As the only Asian and Pacific Islander community-based fund in Southern California, APCF focuses on providing culturally sensitive programs and services to meet the complex and diverse needs of the Asian and Pacific Islander community.

The Brotherhood Crusade founded in 1968, has been dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for families and youth throughout Los Angeles. We provide direct supportive services to programs that address health, education, social welfare, economic development and youth development issues. We promote health and wellness, enhanced educational opportunities and free after school programs.

EarthShare connects people, businesses, and communities with our country's most influential network of environmental nonprofits. EarthShare's Nonprofit Partners are committed to solving our planet's most urgent issues like climate change, environmental justice, access to public lands, sustainable food systems, wildlife conservation, clean water, and many others.

The Kathryn Kurka Children's Health Fund provides glasses, dental care, immunizations and other medical care to LAUSD students with no other resources.

The LAUSD Employee Sponsored Scholarship Fund provides graduating seniors with financial assistance that allows them to enter colleges and universities.

The L.A. Trust for Children's Health brings health and education together to eliminate healthcare inequities and achieve student wellness for all. The L.A. Trust serves as Los Angeles Unified's backbone health entity, bridging the gap between LAUSD, community clinics, mental health providers, advocacy groups and program partners to tackle collaboratively the urgent issues affecting the lives of young people. These issues include substance use prevention, oral health, nutrition, mental health, HPV prevention and sexual and reproductive health. The L.A. Trust has been instrumental in establishing nineteen Student and Family Wellness Centers to serve both student and community members.

The United Latinx Fund (ULF) funds programs that serve the Latino community in the areas of education, in particular non-profit organizations that offer after school activities that help keep youth safe and healthy; and health & wellness- particularly funding organizations that are helping to prevent diabetes, obesity, and heart disease in the Latino community.
